REGULAR SESSION MEETING

MINUTES

MONDAY MARCH 21, 2022 6:30 PM

The Regular Meeting of the White Township Board of Education was held on the above date in the White Township Municipal Building, Belvidere, NJ. The meeting was a hybrid meeting which allowed members of the public to participate in person or virtually. The following members of the Board were in attendance at roll call: Mr. Havlusch, Mrs. Pinkerton, Mrs. Lensi, Mr. Murray, Ms. Nusser-Meany, Mr. Panetta, Mrs. Gardella and Mrs. Vesper. Mr. Thompson, CSA and Mrs. Huff, Business Administrator were also in attendance as well as four members of the public. Mrs. Sroka was unable to attend.

Mr. Panetta opened the meeting at 6:32 p.m. and stated that in accordance with the State's Sunshine Law, adequate notice of this meeting was provided and that copies of this notice, along with a meeting agenda, have been placed in the Board Office, posted on the District website, and sent to the Township Clerk, in accordance with the Open Public Meetings Act.

CSA REPORT

Mr. Thompson recognized our March "Student of the Month" and presented her with a certificate. Mr. Thompson discussed upgrades to the Media Center, field trips, an 8th grade overnight trip, and upcoming standardized testing. 1. Approve a Field Trip for Grade K

To approve a field trip for approximately 30 grade K students to Von Thun Farms, Washington, NJ on May 25, 2022. The cost of the trip is \$15 per student and the cost of the bus transportation is \$250.

2. Approve a Field Trip for Grade 3

To approve a field trip for approximately 24 grade 3 students to Turtle Back Zoo, West Orange, NJ on May 13, 2022. The cost of the trip is \$11 per student and the cost of the bus transportation is \$325.

3. Approve a Field Trip for Grade 5

To approve a field trip for approximately 30 grade 5 students to Lake Hopatcong Floating Classroom, Landing, NJ on May 18, 2022. The cost of the trip is \$18 per student and the cost of the bus transportation is \$225.

OPERATIONS

Mrs. Huff provided an overview of the proposed budget for the 2022-2023 school year and noted there are no personnel or program cuts. Mrs. Huff noted that we'll use grant funds to purchase technology equipment, upgrade our Media Center, provide professional development to staff, and continue our social and emotional learning initiatives, Summer Academy, ESY programs, Jump Start and our club initiatives for students. Mrs. Huff further noted that the budget includes a withdrawal of Capital Reserve funds to support a partial roof replacement project planned for the spring of 2023. Mrs. Huff noted that while general fund expenditures are down about \$125,000, the loss of 25% of our state aid will necessitate a 2% increase to the local tax levy. Mrs. Huff explained that this would equate to a tax increase of approximately \$72/year for the average homeowner in the Township owning a home assessed at \$259,000.

And, a public hearing on the budget for the 2022-2023 school year will be held at the White Township Municipal Building, 555 CR 519, Belvidere, NJ, on Monday, April 25, 2022, at 6:30 p.m.

2. Approve Maximum Travel Allowance and Travel Expense Reimbursement

Pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:23A-7.3, a Board of Education must establish a maximum dollar limit for travel expenditure, as defined in N.J.A.C. 6A:23A-7.1 et seq.,

BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Education includes in the tentative budget a maximum travel expenditure in the amount of \$8,000 for the 2022-2023 school year. The maximum travel expenditure amount for the 2021-2022 school year is \$7,000, of which, \$4,548.99 has been spent, and \$814 is encumbered to date.

The Board of Education recognizes school staff and Board members will incur travel expenses related to and within the scope of their current responsibilities and for travel that promotes the delivery of instruction or furthers the efficient operation of the school district;

AND, N.J.A.C. 6A:23A Subchapter 7 requires Board members to receive approval of these expenses by a majority of the full voting membership of the Board and staff members to receive prior approval of these expenses by the Chief School Administrator and a majority of the full voting membership of the Board;

BE IT RESOLVED, the Board of Education includes in the tentative budget travel and related expense reimbursement in accordance with N.J.A.C. 6A:23A Subchapter 7, to a maximum expenditure of \$8,000 for all staff and board members for the 2022-2023 school year.

The School Business Administrator/Board Secretary shall track and record these costs to ensure that the maximum amount is not exceeded.
