Tips for Encouraging Reading Growth—

for the summer and beyond!

Inspired by Jim Trelease, The Read-Aloud Handbook

- Try to make sure an adult role model is seen reading daily. It works best if you read at the same time as the child.
- Allow children to choose the books they wish to read to themselves, even if they don't meet your high standards.
- Don't take that vacation car trip without recorded books on board. They count too!
- Set some time parameters, short at first and longer as children get older and read more.
- Newspapers and magazines, even comic books, count toward reading time. All of it amounts to exposure to print.
- The self-selection, self-interest factor is the important part. Let children read what interests them.

Our lists offer suggestions, NOT requirements.
